Audra welcomed the group.

- Jamie Jellison – handed out cards for Teresa about the KAEYC conference in October. The Ooey Goey Lady will be there. (see handouts)
- Kris – brought information about E-learning through KACCRA. Reminder that KACCRRRA is now called Child Care Aware of KS. (see handouts)
- Brandi – Social Stars turned 1 yesterday! They graduated 6 kids from the program. They are currently serving 7.
- Susan – is the Tech assistance person assigned to Hays. They have recently trained the last group to go through primary provider coaching approach to providing infant/toddler services. Each *tiny-k* network is now trained in the approach.
- Jackie – Child Start's Public Policy Agenda (see handout) was passed out. Professional Days booklet was passed out. The booklet has grants available for child care providers. No professional development days will be in Butler, but Butler providers can go to other locations.
- Jamie Downs – Flu shots are now available. Also, Cribs for Kids is still going on at the Health Department. They are down to 5 Pack and Plays. This program is for expecting or new parents who cannot afford and do not have a crib or playpen. - Leslie Sissel – Rose Hill Parents As Teachers: Leslie took us on a tour of their facility. They are currently looking for one person to work 10 hours/week. They are currently the only Parents As Teachers program in Butler County. They work with children birth – age 3 with home visits. They can start this service prenatally. They offer events/activities for children and families for children birth – kindergarten. They serve children of all abilities. This year they served 49 families, 72 children. True to her word, Leslie offered cookies and brownies to those in attendance. The brownies were still warm.
