The 12-week long class will begin on Tuesday, May 24 in El Dorado, KS. A free family meal will be served and free child care will be provided. A certificate of attendance will be presented on the last night of class.

Goals of the class are to: strengthen children's social skills and appropriate play skills; promote children's use of self-control strategies; increase emotional awareness, boost academic success, reading, and school readiness; reduce defiance, aggressive behavior, and related conduct problems; decrease children's negative cognitive attributes, enhance conflict manage-

ment approaches; and increase self-esteem and self confidence.

Care 4 Kids: Substitute Service from Child Start

Fully trained substitutes who meet state licensing requirements to provide safe substitute care for child care centers and family child care homes.

All Caring 4 Kids Substitutes

- ◆ Receive background checks
- ◆ Have drug screenings
- ◆ Have current Health Assessments
- ◆ Have current TB test
- ◆ Carry an ID and all requirements with them to all assignments
- ◆ Are Child Start employees

Substitutes are Trained

- ◆ First Aid Introduction/Refresher
- ◆ Child Abuse Recognition and Reporting
- ◆ Signs and Symptoms of Childhood Illness
- ◆ Infant, Child, and Adult CPR
- ◆ Blood Born Pathogens
- ◆ Family Style Meal Service Training
- ◆ Minimum of 10 hours of professional development every year

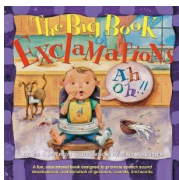
