They have received funding from Kansas Health Foundation grant. The Kansas Association of conservation and Environmental Education has worked on creating Early Childhood appropriate curriculum. Cathy shared examples of this curriculum with us. Cathy also shared information about Eco-Healthy Child Care – designed to help providers and parents understand the dangers of environmental toxins. They are written as instructions for parents on a lower reading level, but are coloring books for children and intended to be something for parents and children to read together. There are also “More Tips” for parents on each topic inside the book.
